Dear Dr. Woolf:

Further to our recent conversation, I am enclosing a copy of our brief to the Ontario Government on environmental assessment (with a summary of our recommednations at the beginning); a copy of the tentative Conservation Council brief; and a letter sent recently to the Counservation Council's Executive Director by our office, outlining a number of immediate differences between our briefs brief's position and theirs.

As I mentioned on the phone, my understanding of the Counservation Council mechanism is that it is a creature made up of 29 member organizations, including the Ontario Medical Association, and the Ontario TB and Respiratorial Diseases Association. Presumably its brief has, in some measure, the tacit support of its membersorganizations.

Therefore, I think the member organizations should be made aware of alternate points of view on the issue of environmental impact assessment, before they lend their support to the Council's tentatively expressed position.

We would ask that you communicate to the O.M.A. President and executive, your support and or Roubohrde fy (to the textent that you find you can support it) and encourage them to do likewise in letters both to the Conservation Council and to Minister Auld (addresses below), with copies of your letters to be sent to us.

You might also make similar representations to Drs. Day and Thompkins (addresses on letter which is also enclosed) who are presently O.M.A. representatives to the Council, and Dr. Thomlinson, representative to the Council for the TB and RD Association.

I hope the enclosed letters will flesh out the background of our concerns in this area for you. If you have any questions or if I have been unusually obfuscating, pleased not hesitate to contact me for clarification and/or elucidation.

I am also enclosing a copy of the Ontario government's non-position paper on this matter which started this whole process.

The deadline for briefs and submissions to the Ministry has been moved up to January 1st, and although they will probably be accepted after that date, it is probably safe to assume that any attempt to influence the Ministry, or to influence the Conservation Council's attempt to influence the Ministry, should be made as soon as possible.
