Since Ontario's lead will bet a precedent for other provincial and federal governments, it is vital that a satisfactory process be implemented from the beginning.

We are also enclosing copies of our association's address to a conference called to discuss the Green Paper, and of two newspaper articles on the conference and on our brief.
