Re: Plant Expansion North of 15th Sideroad

On July 6, 1984, several executive members of the Association of Peel People Evaluating Agricultural Land ('APPEAL') met with the mayor of Brampton to discuss the American Motors' expansion north of the 15th Sideroad. I attended that meeting as APPEAL's counsel.

As you probably know, the area north of the 15th Sideroad has not been approved, under the Planning Act, for industrial use. APPEAL had requested referral of the proposed Official Plan designation to the Ontario Municipal Board on the basis that the land is good agricultural land and should not be urbanized. The minister did refer the matter to the Board but a date for hearing has not yet been set.

We have now been requested by the mayor to forego our right to an Ontario Municipal Board hearing on the basis that the American Motors Plant is important to Brampton and you are intending to commence construction in the fall.

Before APPEAL makes a decision to whether it will withdraw its request for a hearing, we would like to meet with American Motors representatives who are in charge of the plant expansion on these lands. Mrs. Verna Flowers, the chairperson of APPEAL, has been attempting to reach you and Mr. Gee with respect to a meeting but has been unsuccessful. We would ask, therefore, that you contact either Verna Flowers (826-4150) or me in order to set up a meeting.

We look forward to discussing this matter with you.
