As you can see Frank Quinn has agreed to lead off the discussion and give an overview of the impacts of greenhouse on the Great Lakes. Thank you for suggesting him.

Since we have never really focused on this issue, I think we should endeavour to get a good body of resolutions on greenhouse. I hope the air toxics taskforce will be able to do this. Monica Campbell is going to present the City of Toronto's Environmental Protection Office's Strategy to reduce the use of CFC's. I think this strategy offers GLU's members a tangible opportunity to encourage each of their own municipalities to develop a similar strategy. I am sending you clippings of Ontario and Canadian Federal government initiatives on greenhouse.

Phil Jessup is currently doing research on greenhouse gases emitted from automobile exhaust. I think this is a great opportunity for our UAW and CAW people to be involved in a campaign to control and reduce these gases.
