Tell McGuinty to put his nuclear energy plan to an Environmental Assessment!

Last month, the McGuinty government announced that it was choosing nuclear over green power, and would spend over \$40 billion on dirty, dangerous and expensive nuclear power.

Following the release of the government's energy plan, it was revealed that the Liberal Cabinet had secretly passed a regulation to exempt its nuclear electricity plan from a provincial environmental assessment as required by law.

Ontario has the green power potential to keep the lights on and protect the environment. It's simply a political choice whether we repeat past mistakes and go nuclear, or take a new path and go green. Premier McGuinty has sided with the nuclear lobby, and is blocking any meaningful discussion on Ontario's energy future.

An environmental assessment would force the McGuinty government to consider green energy alternatives to its nuclear plan.
