RE: Canada's ratification process to support the listing of nine new POPs under the Stockholm Convention on POPs

We, the undersigned Canadian public interest organizations, are writing to you regarding the important decisions made at the Fourth Conference of the Parties (COP4) under the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) held in May, 2009 in Geneva, Switzerland.

At COP4, delegates reached a historic decision to list nine new POPs (i.e., Pentabromodiphenyl ether (Penta BDE); Octabromodiphenyl ether (OctaBDE); Hexabromobiphenyl (HBB); Lindane; Alpha hexachlorocyclohexane (Alpha HCH); Beta hexachlorocyclohexane (Beta HCH); Perfluorocotane sulfonate (PFOS); Chlordecone; and Pentachlorobenzene (PeCB), for elimination and reduction under the Stockholm Convention. Since Canada, in particular, the Northern region, receives POPs from domestic and international sources, the COP4 decision should provide significant benefits towards protecting the Canadian public and the environment from the impacts of POPs.

We were pleased to see important progress and contributions made by the Canadian delegation at COP4 to ensure that the Stockholm Convention was strengthened and its mandate expanded.

To complement these efforts, we are seeking your official support for the addition of the nine new POPs to the Stockholm Convention. Based on the ratification package prepared by Canada in 2001 for the Stockholm Convention, it is our understanding that Canada must inform the depositary within a year of the decision made at COP4 that it agrees with the listing of these new POPs. As organizations that work on chemical safety issues, we are particularly interested in efforts that promote the elimination mandate under the Stockholm Convention and the commitment made by over 165 Parties under the Convention, to protect human health and the environment from POPs.

We seek your response to this matter and urge the government to submit the required written documents to the depositary to inform them of Canada's agreement to the listing. Furthermore, we urge you to prepare and release a workplan that outlines the development of action plans for the elimination of the POPs and a public engagement component for this undertaking.

As the first country to ratify the Stockholm Convention in 2001, we feel certain that Canada will confirm its commitment to its environment and to protecting the health and safety of Canadians and the global community from the impacts of POPs.

We look forward to the news that Canada has submitted the required legal documents in support of the Stockholm Convention's recent listing of the nine POPs.
