Biodiversity and Habitat Protection

The time is right to call for serious alternatives to current natural resource management in the Great Lakes, but in what form? A binational cooperative agreement on habitat protection? A cooperative citizen's vision statement and action plan?

Following coalition member presentations on public forests, fisheries, watershed and wetlands protection, and special places conservation; we will solicit ideas on how and where to change management and stewardship and begin to establish a coordinated plan of action to protect long-term ecosystem health.
