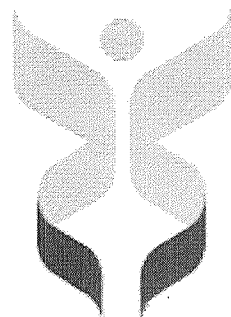

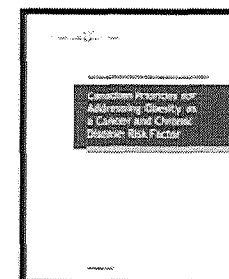

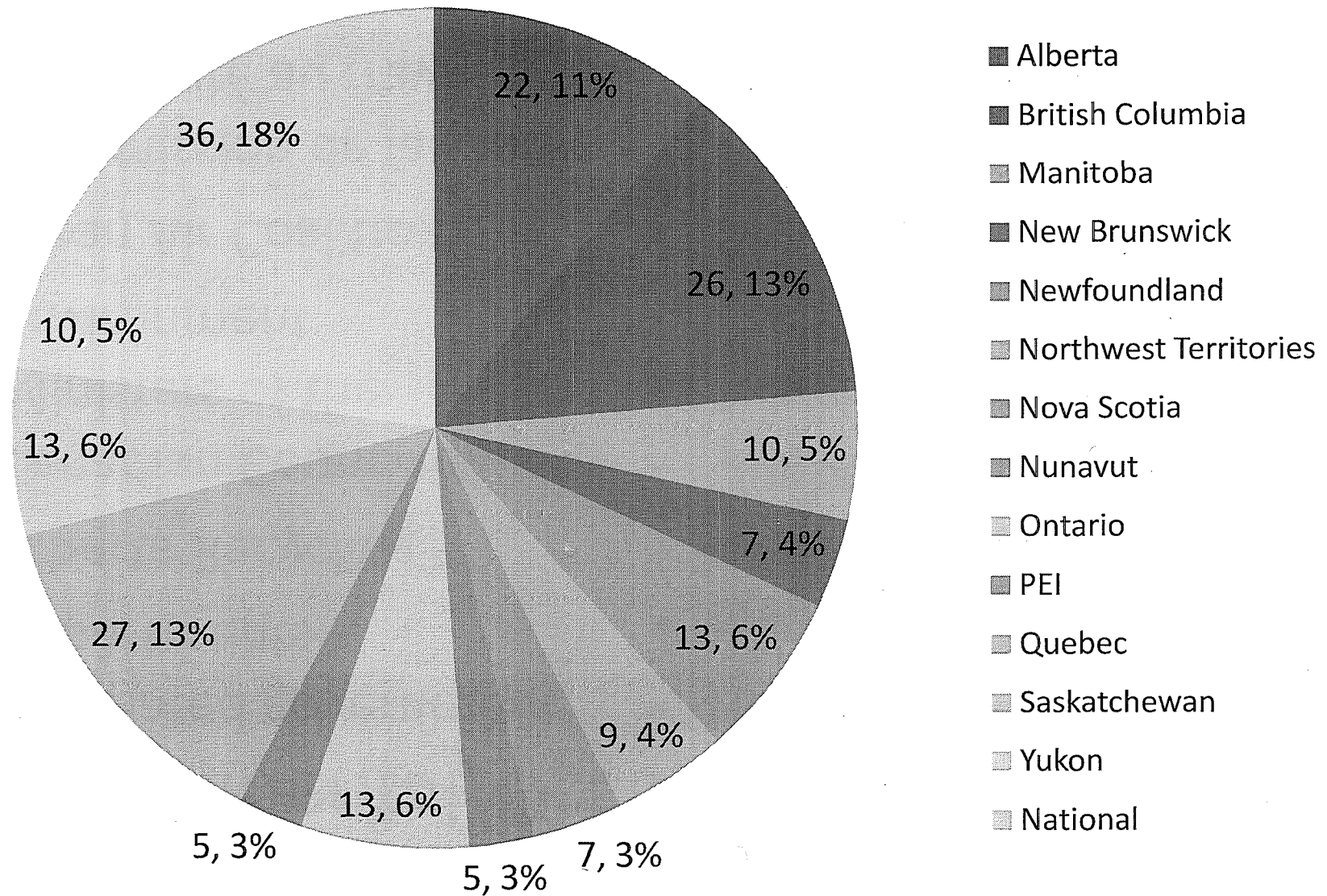

About the Directory

The Prevention Policy Directory is a regularly updated, searchable inventory of Canadian policies as well as legal instruments (legislation, regulations, codes) relating to the key modifiable risk factors for cancer and related chronic diseases: including nutrition, physical activity, alcohol consumption, tobacco control, infectious agents, environmental and occupational exposures, and Ultraviolet radiation.

The Directory is populated by web crawler technology that regularly scans over 200 websites for updates in Canadian policies as well as legal instruments related to the modifiable risk factors for cancer and chronic disease. The original Directory was built on a series of environmental scanning leders, covering all territorial, municipal and school policies and legislation between 1997 and 2007.

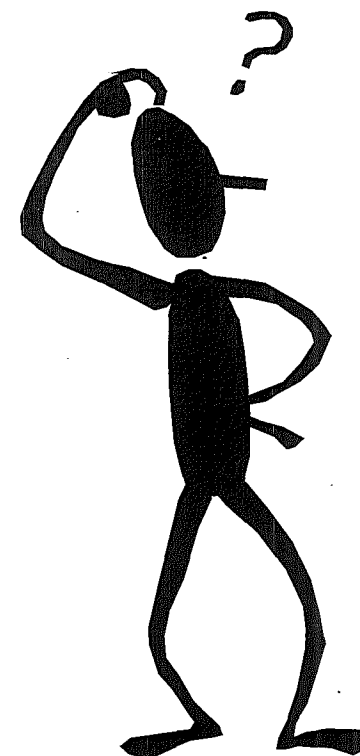

Preventing Avoidable Cancers in Canada

CELA has been a member of the National Committee on Environmental and Occupational Exposures of the Canadian Partnership against Cancer for several years. The mandate of this committee is to research and reduce exposures to carcinogens. We hope that several important projects resulting from this committee's work will quickly gather attention across the country.

The first is an accredited **e-course** for doctors and other primary care providers to learn how to recognize and respond to occupational and environmental cancers. This course can be found on the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety's website focuses on practical skills in taking exposure histories and uses case studies as examples.

CAREX Canada extends the work of the global CAREX network tracking occupational and environmental exposures. Paul Demers and his team at the University of British Columbia with grants from NCEO are developing estimates of the number of Canadians exposed to carcinogens in workplace and community environments. These estimates will provide significant support for targeting exposure reduction strategies and cancer prevention programs. By bringing together data from across Canada on sources and levels of exposure, they have begun to identify regional differences and vulnerable populations. CAREX Canada will create a significant new resource for policy makers and researchers to prevent cancer. <http://www.carexcanada.ca/>.
