## PROJECT PROPOSAL

## Voluntary Groups' Efforts for Public Safety

Our system of safety is currently being challenged on several fronts by various voluntary groups. The food we eat, the type of environment we have, our health situation, the mechanical and electrical standards established and the dangers from radiation are some of the concerns these groups are pressing in a growing cambaign for public safety.

The paper's focus would then be on several brief case studies of voluntary action for public safety. For example:

- electrical safety the Concerned Consumers Foundation fight for safe wiring in homes.
- occupational health safety the United Steelworkers campaign for labour safety standards at Elliot Lake.
